Creekside Park Brings New Rec. to Ringgold

Creekside Park is set to open later this month in Ringgold, and with it comes the chance for residents and visitors to explore new recreation opportunities. Crews have been working behind Patriot Hall for 6 months to complete Phase 1 of the Ringgold Recreation Project. Now finished, this portion of the project provides much-needed parking, a basketball court, and 10 new pickleball courts for the community to enjoy. As these are the first pickleball courts in Ringgold, this is an entirely new recreational offering and is expected to increase sports tourism in the area. Phase 2 of this project is anticipated to start soon and will bring even more options for outside play in the Ringgold area.
